MEASURED AGAINST NUMBERS alone, last year we continued the exceptional performance that has always defined ACCESS College Foundation. For the 2008-09 year, about 3,400 South Hampton Roads' high school seniors earned over \$31 million in financial aid and scholarships, and ACCESS awarded its 5,000th Last Dollar Scholarship—to bridge the gap between funds ACCESS helped a student find for college and what it actually costs.

- ACCESS advisors schedule appointments with every junior and senior whose GPA is 2.5 or higher to help with college plans. This includes registering for college entrance tests

like the SAT and ACT, assisting with college admission applications and helping file for financial aid and scholarships. Last year, that added up to individual appointments with nearly 10,000 students—4,651 juniors and 4,877 seniors.

- Last year alone, ACCESS funded or helped waive over \$200,000 in SAT and college

application fees for 1,800 low-income students.

- Often after financial aid is assembled, several hundred dollars still stand in the way of paying for college and can mean the critical difference in attending. ACCESS addresses the problem through Last Dollar Scholarships—so far over 5,000 totaling \$4.5 million.

AN EARLIER START. A *stronger* FINISH.

MIDDLE SCHOOL EARLY COLLEGE AWARENESS PROGRAM—The strong grades and college-bound mindset needed for scholarships and admission to good schools should begin well before high school. Targeting middle school students and their parents with college preparedness information and services can make all the difference. With the 2009-10 school year, ACCESS launched college readiness initiatives in Norfolk and Portsmouth middle

schools to do just that. An ACCESS Early College Awareness advisor in these schools is working directly with families who most need help to lay the groundwork for college.

COLLEGE SUCCESS PROGRAM—Staying in college is as critical as starting college. Because of the great difficulties many ACCESS Scholars face, they often need extra support to complete their degrees. Two years ago we introduced the College Success Program in colleges attended by the majority of ACCESS Scholars.* Our advisor visits each campus to help students navigate college and reapply for financial aid and scholarships. Results show 95% of students in the College Success Program are still enrolled in their third year, exceeding the national average of 63%.
