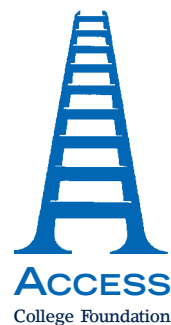

• **NEW HEADQUARTERS**

Our larger main office, adjoining the Norfolk Fitness and Wellness Center, is easy to reach and allows us to better serve our constituents.

• **NEW SERVICES**

Right-sizing our program means the 16 advisors can better serve students in the 28 public high schools in South Hampton Roads.

• **NEW AWARENESS**

Through expanded marketing and public relations efforts, more students, parents and potential donors are learning about ACCESS and its services.

Reaching those three goals is one way ACCESS continues raising the level of service it provides to students and parents.

As the Chairman of ACCESS, I am happy to report that 2005-06 was a very good year in other ways as well. More than 10,000 seniors received college advisory services from ACCESS. ACCESS also helped these students leverage \$23 million in financial assistance that made enrollment in college possible.

For every \$1 that goes to direct program services, we leverage \$16 in financial aid and scholarships for our students. Over our 18 years, we have helped more than 50,000 students take college entrance exams, enroll in college and amass \$150 million in financial aid and scholarships.

Moving to a larger main office makes **ACCESS** easier to reach and offers better service to its constituents.

AFTER 17 YEARS of having its headquarters in the Norfolk Public Schools Administration building on City Hall Avenue, ACCESS outgrew that space in 2006 due to the doubling in size of the program in 3 years. The New Year was welcomed by relocating the main office to a larger space that adjoins the Norfolk Fitness and Wellness Center, near Ward's Corner.

Now the administrative staff has breathing room and advisors have meeting rooms to use. With I-64 close by, the new location is convenient to surrounding cities and offers ample free parking.

The 2,800 square feet of space contains a conference room, training room, offices for all staff, filing room, storage room and reception area. All of this enables ACCESS to better oversee

the program and communicate more efficiently with staff, volunteers, donors, students and their families.

The move wouldn't have happened without community support. Norfolk Mayor Paul Fraim and ACCESS Co-Founder Joshua P. Darden, Jr., along with other officials from the City Manager's office, were integral in finding a new location for ACCESS.

A grant from The Norfolk Foundation covered a large portion of the renovation expenses. RGI General Contractors handled the renovations. HBA Architecture & Interior Design in Virginia Beach worked on the office design as their contribution to the office relocation. Wachovia Bank and Signature Financial Management contributed many of the office furnishings.

Thanks to thoughtful and generous supporters, ACCESS had a smooth move into its new headquarters at 7300 Newport Avenue.

BECAUSE EACH HIGH SCHOOL in South Hampton Roads has slightly different needs, in 2006 ACCESS focused on developing standards and measures of success that are based on the specific variables of each high school served.

The benefits of customizing services for each high school were also confirmed by a study conducted by the Program for Research and Evaluation in Public Schools, part of Old Dominion University's Darden College of Education.

In April, the results of a year-long formal evaluation of the ACCESS program were reported. The evaluation recommended a plan and schedule for right-sizing the services offered in each high school, a plan that closely modeled the ideas and strategies ACCESS management had already been developing.

As a result, the 28 public high schools in South Hampton Roads are now supported by 16 ACCESS Advisors who provide between two and three

days of service every week at each school. At their two-day schools, advisors work with juniors and seniors; at their three-day schools, they work with all grade levels.

To interest more students in becoming involved with ACCESS, it is crucial that advisors bond with students and gain their trust, as well as the trust of their parents. Advisors are able to develop ongoing relationships with students and better manage future plans beyond high school.

Thanks to the new service structure, ACCESS advisors are getting the college message to more students and parents. This means more public high school students are heading to college.

of their annual auction, the greater they can support our mission. They generously donated a portion of the proceeds from the 2005 Classic to allow us to freshen up our image and develop brand guidelines. As a result, ACCESS has a stronger presence in the South Hampton Roads community.
